AKA HOTELS

More like deluxe condos than Residence Inns, the eight locations of this swank chain are ideal for playing host. Penthouses are outfitted with woodburning outdoor fireplaces, mid-century-inspired furniture, and wet bars. And to help you make the most of your locale, the concierge can arrange in-suite wine tastings or classes from star chefs. PALIHOUSE HOLLOWAY

This West Hollywood hotel's loftlike quarters will likely make your own apartment feel a bit underdesigned. With Chesterfield sofas, Saarinen tables, Bertoia chairs, and Noguchi lamps, the 36 spaces—ranging from 750 to a sprawling 1,900 square feet—are showy in a way your real home shouldn't be. If you're looking for someplace green to hang your (hemp) hat, the seven locations of Starwood's new project have energy-efficient bulbs, water-saving bathroom appliances, and saline (i.e., unchlorinated) swimming pools. Plus, cooking a meal in-room doesn't require scoping out a local Trader Joe's, thanks to a lobby pantry stocked with wine, artisanal meats, and pasta-all organic, of course. NO. 5 MADDOX STREET

This serene 12-suite hotel, set in a townhouse in London's Mayfair, delivers the requisite amenities (Frette linens, REN skin-care products) and design accents (mirrored fireplaces, limestone tiles) of a luxury hotel-without the trying "May I get the door, sir?" service. When you tire of Bond Street shopping (and of the exchange rate), settle into your terrace with your drink of choice-the staff will stock your fridge-and take in the rooftops of central London.
